June 18 (E-141)	City Council/ City Clerk	<u>Deadline to Adopt Resolution Calling Election</u> Deadline to adopt resolutions regarding ordering election including incumbents and offices to be filled. Requesting San Bernardino County Elections Office to conduct election.
*July 9 (E-120)	City Council / City Clerk	<u>Deadline to Adopt Regulations Regarding Candidate Statements</u> Deadline for jurisdictions to adopt or amend regulations regarding charges for printing candidate statements.
July 16 to Aug. 10 (E-113 to E-88)	Candidates / City Clerk	<u>Candidate Filing / Withdrawal Period</u> Candidates may request and file candidate filing documents in order to run for office. Candidates may withdraw their nomination until the close of the nomination period.
July 31	Candidates / Committees / City Clerk	<u>Deadline FPPC: Semi-Annual Filing</u> Candidates and Committees campaign disclosure statements are due.
Aug.10 to Aug. 15 (E-87 to E-83)	Candidates / City Clerk	<u>Candidate Filing Extension Period</u> If an incumbent fails to file candidate filing documents by August 10, 2018, there will be a 5-calendar-day extension during which any candidate, other than the incumbent, may file.
Aug. 20 to Aug. 27 (E-78 to E-71)	City Clerk	<u>Candidate Statement Public Examination Period</u> Candidate statements are available for public examination. During this period, any citizen may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring the material in the statements to be amended or deleted.
Aug. 10 (E-88)	Candidates / City Clerk	<u>Deadline to Withdraw Candidate Statements</u> Last day to withdraw candidate statements unless there is an extension of the nomination period. Withdrawal of candidate statements must be in writing to the City Clerk
Aug. 15 (E-83)	City Council	<u>Deadline to Withdraw Measure</u> Whenever a legislative body has ordered that a measure be submitted to the voters of any jurisdiction at an election, the order of election shall not be amended or withdrawn after this date.
Aug. 16 (E-82)	Candidates / City Clerk	<u>Deadline to Withdraw Candidate Statements Submitted During Extension Period</u> In the event there is an extension of the nomination period, candidates may have until this date to withdraw their candidate's statement. Withdrawal of candidate statements must be in writing to the City Clerk.

Sept. 25 to Oct. 16 (E-40 to E-21)	Elections Office	<p align="center"><u>Voter Information Guide Mailed Voters</u></p> Elections Office shall mail a Voter Information Guide to each voter, who is registered at least 29 days prior to the election.
Oct. 8 to Nov. 5 (E-29 to E-1)	Elections Office	<p align="center"><u>Early Voting Period</u></p> Early Voting is available at the Elections Office and at off-site locations. Locations can be found at www.sbcountyelections.com .
Oct. 9 to Nov. 6 (E-28 to E)	Elections Office	<p align="center"><u>Mail Ballot Drop Off Period</u></p> Mail Ballot Drop off locations are available to receive ballots. Locations can be found at www.sbcountyelections.com .
Sept. 26 (E-40)	Candidates / Committees / City Clerk	<p align="center"><u>Deadline FPPC: 1st Pre-Election Campaign Statement Filing</u></p> Candidates must file the first pre-election campaign disclosure statement.
Oct. 22 (E-15)	Elections Office	<p align="center"><u>Deadline to Submit Voter Registration</u></p> Last day to register to vote in this election.
Oct. 25 (E-12)	Candidates / Committees / City Clerk	<p align="center"><u>Deadline FPPC: 2nd Pre-Election Campaign Statement Filing</u></p> Candidates must file the second pre-election campaign disclosure statement
Oct 30 (E-7)	Voters/ Elections Office	<p align="center"><u>Deadline to Submit Vote by Mail Ballot Applications</u></p> Applications to receive a mail ballot must be received by the Elections by this date.
Nov. 6		<p align="center"><u>Election Day</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Vote by Mail. Mail ballots may be returned to any mail ballot drop-off location during normal business hours, to any polling place within the county and to the Elections Office. 2) Vote at assigned polling place.
