


The 38th Annual Grand Terrace Country Fair

Saturday, November 2, 2019 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
at Grand Terrace Civic Center 22795 Barton Rd.



Anyone 18 or older, who lives or works in Grand Terrace or are students of Grand Terrace art/craft teachers, may participate in the fair upon acceptance of application. Children ages 10-17 may participate in the Children's Cookie Contest.

You may:

- ~ Sell your home-made arts and crafts, home-grown plants and produce. (Participants may NOT sell food other than produce.)
- ~ display or demonstrate a hobby or collection. ~ join the Scarecrow Competition
- ~ enter the cooking competition in these categories: Chili, cakes, cookies, pies, breads, salsas, candy and/or preserves.



Food contest entries are to be delivered to the fairgrounds by 8:30 a.m. and are sold after judging by the committee to help defray expenses.

No one is allowed on the premises before 7 a.m. on the day of the fair. Please, plan to keep your booth/table open until 3 p.m. Spaces will be assigned at the Check-in table. Country Fair Guidelines

PLEASE READ!

1. "For Profit" organizations will not be allowed to pass out literature or items advertising their businesses. However, if Grand Terrace store-owners or home-based businesses wish to sell their own handmade arts or crafts, they may distribute cards or flyers advertising that business, as long as it is art or craft related.
2. Items for sale must be hand-made, finished products, not kits or supplies to make the product. Packaged "gift-baskets" must not contain food (i.e. candy, drinks, cookies, etc.) or items which are not handmade by the entrant.
3. All Fair Applications should be sent to or delivered by hand to City Hall and received by the Committee no later than the deadline on the application (unless granted special permission by the Committee to submit later.) No applications will be accepted at the Fair. **NEW PROCEDURE: All applications received are automatically accepted. If, however, the application does not meet the guidelines, a member of the committee will contact you directly for discussion.** You may email GTcountryfair@gmail.com to confirm or ask questions.
4. All participants in the food contests must disclose on their food entry any use of alcohol or common allergens such as peanuts or tree nuts.
5. Homegrown plants and homegrown produce may be sold. NO FOOD items, besides produce, may be sold at the fair.
6. NO POLITICAL ACTIVITY allowed.
7. Any requests not covered in these guidelines must be brought to the Historical and Cultural Activities Committee for a decision.
8. **ABSOLUTELY no one is allowed on the premises before 7 a.m. and may not set up until checked in** and given instructions on where to set up. At that time you may drive in to your location and unload. Then you must remove your vehicle immediately to the designated parking area. If you can, please park as far from the venue as possible to allow the public more spots nearby which will encourage their attendance. Absolutely no driving in the vendor area after 8:45 a.m. Tables, chairs, and canopies are NOT provided. Please bring your own. The allotted space is approx. 10 x 10 ft. per vendor.

Scarecrow Contest Guidelines

Eligibility:

Entries must be created by a person who lives or works in Grand Terrace and may have help from members of their family and friends. Local businesses may participate and may include a 5 x 7 inch sign or logo of their business info.

One entry per family / group.

There is no entry fee. Each entry will receive a certificate of participation. Winners will receive ribbons.

Construction:

Scarecrow display may include props (including floral arrangements, straw bales, etc.), but must fit within a 4' x 4' foot area and maintain some element of the traditional, handmade or assembled scarecrow such as natural elements and real clothing. No pre-assembled, store-bought scarecrows should be used.

Scarecrow must be free-standing, stable (not top-heavy), and have no likelihood of tipping over.

Scarecrow display should be no taller than 6 feet in height, (with the exception of balloons, cornstalks or secure flags).

Must be family-friendly. Nothing depicting violence, or themes inappropriate for viewing by children will be allowed.

The committee reserves the right to deny or remove items or displays that do not meet the guidelines or are deemed inappropriate. No political ads, propaganda, images or info allowed.

Set up may begin on site at 7 a.m. and must be removed by 4 p.m. Anything left later than that may be discarded.

Please be aware that the scarecrow display will not be under constant watch by the committee or City representatives. If you are concerned about items being taken, you are welcome to set up a chair and remain at your display to protect it. The entrant is solely responsible for any theft or damage that may occur to their display.
